

2018 Year End Stats

Total Clients Served

• 104 clients were served between the Transitional Housing Program, Aftercare, and Outreach (increase of 13)

Admission Related Statistics

- 294 clients have been served in the Transitional Housing Program since inception
- 46 clients were served in the Transitional Housing Program in 2018 (*increase of 1*)
- 170 referrals were received for the Transitional Housing Program (increase of 16)
- 2,763 bed days were recorded / 63% occupancy (increase of 226 bed days or 5%)

Discharge Statistics

- 38 discharges took place (decrease of 2)
 - o 24% (9) returned to family members (*decrease of 2*)
 - o 18% (7) transitioned to community programs appropriate to their needs (decrease of 6)
 - o 37% (14) transitioned into independent living (decrease of 1)
 - o 8% (3) discharge placements are unknown (*increase of 1*)
 - o 13% (5) were "temporary placements" and spent less than 72 hours in the residence (new category)

Education

- 70% (32) of our residents stay in, or return to school (increase of 8)
- 32% (12) of our residents already acquired their high school diploma (no change)

Employment

- 46% (21) found or maintained employment with us (*increase of 6*)
- 30% (14) actively sought employment, but did not acquire a position during their placement (decrease of 3)

Mental Health

- 72% (33) residents were diagnosed with, or self-identify as having a mental health issue (decrease of 7)
- 57% (26) residents had concurrent disorders (more than 1 combination of mental health diagnosis, learning disability, addiction issue, or physical disability) (*decrease of 5*)

Substance Use

• 72% (33) residents possessed substance use or addiction issues (*increase of 3*)

Demographics

- 18.6 years of age was the average for residents served
- 15% (7) were refugees or landed immigrants, and could be classified as "new Canadians" (no change)
- 28% (13) residents identified as part of the LGBT2Q+ community (increase of 5)

Aftercare

- 69 past-residents were served through the Aftercare program (decrease of 3)
- 23 outreach clients were served (i.e. male youth who have not been in the Transitional Housing Program).
- 2,166 total aftercare supports provided (e.g. emotional support, referrals for service, housing assistance) (increase of 821)

System Navigation

• 380+ referrals for various community programs have been provided by WRYM this year (increase of 80)

Success Rate, (residents who left the street): 92% with a 3 year average of 90%
